Dirk got the best of both worlds growing up on a rural farmstead in Northern Madison County with Des Moines 20 minutes away. Dirk received his education from Van Meter and attended one building K-12. He was taught by many exceptional teachers and also by his parents and a loving extended family. All three Waller kids were in high school together. Dirk and his sister followed his older brother in the tradition of doing IHSSA speech. The kids were taught by each other in the living room practice performance area with honest feedback from Mom and an occasional "Nice" comment from Dad. Literature resources ranged from the ever present Reader's Digest, childhood books, and once in a while-- the Edna Means dramatic services.

Dirk graduated from Van Meter in 1988 and was the proud recipient of the John Phillips Sousa outstanding band student. He was the only senior in band his senior year. Dirk attended Northwest Missouri State University graduating with a B.S. in Secondary Education Social Studies. After substitute teaching for a semester, he landed his first job as an extended U.S. History substitute teacher at South Tama. The next year he was hired at North Tama as a social studies teacher and in his third year took over speech after saying, "Oh, I did speech in high school." In 2000, Dirk became a history teacher and speech coach at Council Bluffs Abraham Lincoln. Dirk earned his masters degree in 2014 in Educational leadership from Doane College. In 2022 Dirk, took on the role of New Teacher Mentor and currently serves two middle schools and two high schools mentoring 16 new teachers in the area of special education.

Dirk and his wife Kristi pride themselves on both being educators who are tied to the success of their students. In 2013 they began sponsoring Isaac Ndagijimana from Rwanda and he has become their Rwandan son and is completing his senior year at University of Nebraska Omaha.
